After our groundbreaking ceremony on September 2nd, the project moved very slowly until we participated in the Watertown Winter Show in February. Veterans responded through our advertising and personal inquiries which netted applications from 36 different states including Hawaii.

Getting the message out seemed very difficult. We sent Public Service Announcements to 25 surrounding newspapers and frequently called our local radio station. Still people were calling in telling us this was the first time they had heard about our memorial.

At Dedication time we have approximately 1750 names for our wall. With these veterans and the corporate sponsores, we now have excess funds and ordered playground equipment. It is our desire to entertain and build strong bodies for our children. Ultimately they will grow up and take our place in assuring us our freedom for generations to come. If some enter the military, we invite them to put their names on our wall.
